The ABA Clinic

Executive function skills regulate and control an individual's cognitive functions which play a critical role in managing the multiple tasks of daily life.

In school this means:

- thinking before acting
- using existing knowledge to engage in new tasks
- initiating tasks
- controlling impulses and emotions
- planning and problem solving
- time management
- organization
- focusing on goal
- self monitoring and evaluating progress

Participants will learn specific strategies which will increase executive function success in the home as well as be provided with specific tools to bridge communication and achievement in school.

Ms. Armstrong has been working with children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders, behavioral, learning and developmental disabilities for twenty years; specializing in inclusive education, social skills and professional and technical support for teachers, families and school teams in the utilization of the technologies of applied behavior analysis to achieve successful and significant outcomes for individuals and their families.
