**Whereas**, the Hardyston Township Board of Education desires to apply for this waiver due to the fact that it projects having fewer than 40 Medicaid eligible classified students OR participation in SEMI would not provide a cost benefit to the district based on the projection of the district's available SEMI reimbursement for the 2018-19 budget year (\$15,045.68) (37 students projected).

**Now Therefore Be It Resolved** that the Hardyston Township Board of Education hereby authorizes the Chief School Administrator to submit to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools in the County of Sussex an appropriate waiver of the requirements of NJAC 6A23A-5.3 for the 2018-19 school year.
