#### **HEALTH OFFICE NEWS**

It is hard to believe that November is already here! The Health Office would like to remind our families that flu shots are available in many locations and we encourage you to protect yourself against the flu! The flu shot is generally covered by insurance; if insurance is a problem contact the office of Public Health Nursing at 973-579-0570, they will be happy to assist.

Reminder that as the temperatures begin to drop, please make sure that your child is appropriately dressed for those chilly mornings at the bus stop!

November is "American Diabetes Month", a month set aside to raise awareness of this ever growing disease. It is the vision of the American Diabetes Association to have a life free of diabetes and all of the burdens it causes. Here are some facts about diabetes:

- Nearly 30 million children and adults in the U.S. have diabetes.
- Nearly 86 million Americans have prediabetes and are at risk to develop type 2 diabetes.
- The national cost of diabetes in the U.S. is \$245 billion.
- Diabetes is the leading cause of blindness and kidney failure in adults.
- Diabetes increases the risk of heart disease.
- Diabetes is the 7<sup>th</sup> leading cause of death in the U.S., directly causing 70,000 deaths per year and contributing to thousands more.

Although genes influence the development of diabetes, behavior and lifestyle also have great influence. Making a few lifestyle changes can decrease the chance of developing diabetes (type 2)!

- Control your weight!
- Get moving and turn off the television!
- Choose whole grains and whole grain products over highly processed carbohydrates
- Skip sugary drinks, and choose water.
- Choose good fats instead of bad fats. Good fats are the ones found in liquid vegetable oils, nuts and seeds.
- Limit red meat and avoid processed meats; choose nuts, grains, poultry and fish.
- If you smoke, try to quit.

#### **PEANUT ALLERGY INFORMATION**

When sending in any food products to school, parents and guardians need to pay close attention to nutrition labels. In order to provide the safest environment for all of our students with food allergies, we are asking that you follow a VERY STRICT, NO PEANUT OR TREE NUT policy when sending in foods that are to be shared. Every food item that is made at home must also be accompanied by the labels of the ingredients that you used in your food preparation. Please make sure that there are NO PEANUT / TREE NUT INGREDIENTS in any food products that you send in. If either peanuts or tree nuts are part of the ingredients, the food item will not be sent to the classroom and will have to be sent back home. Also, please be sure to look for any disclaimers that state "This product may be manufactured in a plant that also processes peanuts or tree nuts."

#### **CLEAN HABITS FOR STAYING HEALTHY**

Washing hands thoroughly and often is your best defense in staying healthy. Always wash hands:

- After coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose
- After using the bathroom
- Before and after preparing or eating food
- Before and after changing a Diaper

#### **DELAYED OPENINGS**

In preparation for the upcoming winter months, we would like to remind you about school procedures regarding **delayed openings** or **early dismissals**. Please listen to any of the local radio stations, WSUS (102.3 FM), WNNJ (103.7 FM), WHCY (106.3 FM) and WNNJ (1360 AM) and local television channels (ABC, News12, NBC, Fox5), for reports of delayed openings, early dismissals or school closures. Our parent notification system will also be activated. Please visit our website for more information and please be certain to let us know of any change in contact information.

In the event of a **delayed opening**, school will begin ninety (90) minutes after the normal opening time. Therefore, for a delayed opening the Middle School will open at 9:30 AM and the Elementary School at 10:10 AM.

NOTE: STUDENTS MAY NOT BE DROPPED OFF BEFORE THESE TIMES.

#### EARLY DISMISSAL

**Early dismissal time due to inclement weather may vary depending on the circumstances that may surface at those times.** Early dismissal time is 12:35 PM at the MS and 1:15 PM at the ES for the normal pre-approved scheduled half days for holidays, conferences, etc. Again, AM and PM preschool students are to follow the schedule that was sent home previously. Please be reminded that no elementary school student will be dropped off at a bus stop without a parent or guardian present.
